LOCAL BOATS SHINE

Several local boats met with mixed success during Sunday's Southern 80 ski race.

Osprey won the expert unlimited outboard class in 42 minutes, 18 seconds with skiers Craig Beehag and R. Johnstone. Driver was G. Johnstone and observer D. Jones.

Winner of the expert under 5.2 litre and six cylinder class was Kyabram boat Citation driven by its owner, J. Westerveld, with M. Andrews observing and skiers M. Campbell and R. Gribben.

Third in the expert under 16 years class was Alabama towing local skiers Jamie Oliver and Adam Smith. K. Oliver was the driver and G. Smith the observer.

Barrie Beehag's boat, aptly named "B.B.B.," won the expert open women class with Barrie driving, son Tony observing, and daughter-in-law Sue skilling with her sister Caren Robbinson.

Ross Bulley's Hoshle was second in the novice under six litre V-drive and up to 201 horsepower outboard class with R. Lowndes observing and skiers Trevor Robinson and G. Richardson.

Trevor's own boat, Graffiti, also met with success when placed third in the novice six-cylinder centre mount

and up to 116 horsepower outboard class. Graffiti was driven by M. Lovegrove with H. Rogers observing and B. and C. O'Donnell skilling.

The Riverine Herald sponsored Corporation Ski Team entry in that class was placed seventh with Greg Sheen driving, Janette Grimison observing and skiers Grant Taylor and Peter Macdonald.

Phil Woods' Thunda God was second in the novice open women class with Leon Sharp at the wheel, Phil observing and skiers A. Woods and R. Thorne.

The novice juniors under 16 years class was won by Rochester boat Wild Cat driven by W. Williams with P. Hughes observing and M. Williams and S. Hughes skilling.

Third in that class was Shepparton boat Fleetwood driven by Terry Bennett with P. Howard observing and N. and W. Bennett skilling.

Peter Dolan's Boss Hog won the novice sub-juniors class with N. Oliver observing and T. Oliver and T. Dolan skilling. Third in that class was Deniliquin boat Lil Boat Blue.

The event that drew perhaps the most concentrated interest on Sunday was nothing to do with skiing but the Vincents Retra-vision Inaugural Southern 80 wet T-shirt competition during the lunch break.

Some 14 entrants strutted their stuff for a huge crowd after first being wet down by Mr. John Vincent.

First by popular acclaim was Linda Farnsworth from Mornington, followed closely by two Echucas, Donna Sampson and Lin Dohnt.

The girls picked up prizes worth \$200 for first, \$70 for second and \$50 for third.

The invitation Bare-foot Drags, staged between the finish of the race and the presentation of trophies, was won by John Brain of Shepparton, defeating Gavin O'Mahoney of Echuca in the final.

ECHUCA THE KINGS OF ONE-DAY COMPETITION

The Echuca A Grade representative cricket team is the best one-day side in the Goulburn Zone.

This was proved on Sunday when Echuca beat Deniliquin in the final of the W and T Tanks one-day competition.

Playing at Rochester against the reigning premiers and favorites on the day, Echuca played with composure for the whole game to record a fine win. Deniliquin have won the competition for the past two seasons and were desperately trying for the hat-trick.

However, Echuca had different ideas. Denil's innings started with a flurry of runs, with G. Nesbitt and K. Perrin picking up the ball well.

With the score on 26, the New South Wales team lost two wickets and some accurate bowling from Chris Saddler and Dave Jackson enabled Echuca to regain a steady hold on the game.

Deniliquin, through Steve Bray and P. Thorpe, took their score to 67 before another wicket was lost. However, they were battling slowly and put a lot of pressure on the lower order.

A partnership from Greg Danckert and Wayne Pitts added some respectability to the Deniliquin score.

After 30 overs Denil were 93, averaging just over three runs per over, but Danckert and Pitts took the score from 86 to 136. As the Deniliquin innings drew to a close it looked as though Echuca could keep them under 160, but Ron Jennings ended this idea.

He hit 18 off the last over to take Deniliquin to 9-177 from 45 overs — a score that was gettable on the improving wicket. With the score at three the Echuca innings struck disaster. Craig Healey went for a hook shot off Peter Unwin and the ball flew high over gully's head. Ron Jennings, with quick reflexes, ran backwards and picked up a great catch.

Gary Larcombe and Kevin Neville then steadied proceedings a little before Neville was brilliantly run out for 15. With the score on 51 Echuca had double bad luck with Larcombe going for 19 and Mark Gardiner for 12.

With the score on 125 Denham was out for 40 including two enormous sixes and three fours which put Echuca in a position to win.

Captain of the team, Jimmy Hartshorn and his brother Teddy coolly took Echuca to victory with two overs to spare.
